- Project launched in 2013
- Historical project of the foundation
- Ongoing and successful project
- Good state of infrastructures



- Where we stand:
 - Achievements:
 - Za'atari and Azraq refugee camps
 - Training of male and female instructors
 - Training and setting up of a coordination unit
 - Construction of infrastructures
 - Organization of daily sports and recreational activities (football, zumba, judo, e-sport, reading...)
 - Organization of competitions and events within the refugee camps
 - Ownership of the project













- Where we stand:

 - Outside refugee camps
 - Project implemented through schools
 - Several training seminars for PE teachers (including Karak, Aqaba, Amman and Mafraq)











- Where we stand:
 - Achievements:
 - Some numbers
 - 434 coaches trained (124 female coaches)
 - 37'000 children have been participated since the beginning
 - Coordination unit: 7 (28 coaches) in Za'atari and 2 (16 coaches) in Azraq
 - Beneficiaries in Azraq: 2'300 children in Azraq (boys 1'300 and girls 1'000)
 - Beneficiaries in Za'atari: 6'200 children (boys 3'500 and girls 2'700)



- Where we stand:
 - Achievements:

 - Za'atari refugee camp
 - Number of refugees has been stable since 2015
 - Around 80,000 people
 - 50% female
 - 54% under 18 years old

- Where we stand:
 - Azraq refugee camp
 - Number of refugees slighting going up since 2019
 - Around 50'000 people
 - 49% female
 - 59% under 18 years old
